1. **Call to order**
The meeting was called to order by Jamie Martinez at 10:02 am.
2. **Welcome by Jamie Martinez, Chair**
Welcome remarks were provided by Jamie Martinez. He stated that he works with the Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD).
3. **Safety Moment**
The safety moment was provided by LaReina Reyes, who discussed prescription medication and CDL drivers. Legal prescription medications cause more crashes than legal ones. If you are taking prescription medications and driving commercial vehicles, make sure you inform your physician of your driver status and discuss any potential side effects or issues you may encounter when driving.
4. **Roll call and introductions**

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5. **Call to the public**

No public comments were made.

6. **Minutes from the previous meeting**

A motion to approve the minutes from the February 20, 2026, meeting was provided by Marga Gamas. Jason Snead seconded the motion. The approval was unanimously approved.

7. **Inclusion and Adaptive Living Commission Update**

Updates on the Commission on Inclusion and Adaptive Living (CIAL) were provided by Jamie Martinez. He stated that he is also the chair of the committee, and they now meet on the 3rd Wednesday of every other month, from 11 am to 1 pm. The 5/29/26 meeting was attended by 7 members and was facilitated by the Lancaster Group. They discussed the strengths and weaknesses of the group.

8. **MetroPlan Planning Update**

MetroPlan updates were provided by Kim Austin, Transportation Demand Management Planner. Kim provided information about MetroPlan's Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program, including the SRTS Programs Plan and goals to encourage multimodal transportation.

9. **Coordinated Plan Major Update**

Major updates to the 2027 Coordinated Public Transit Human Services Transportation Plan were presented by LaReina. They began with an overview of the 5310 grant, the current cycle schedule, and the purpose and intent of the major updates. The categories of transportation gaps were presented:

- Informational
- Temporal
- Spatial
- Infrastructure
- Human Capital

The major updates for 2027 include:

1. Crosswalk signal improvements (infrastructure gap)-signal type and timing
2. Developer Coordination and Transit-oriented Design (informational gap)-encourage universal design, and improve early coordination with developers

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3. Strengthen Coordination with Non-emergency medical transportation providers (temporal services)-explore the after-hours and on-demand access to and from Flagstaff Medical Center and identify partnership opportunities.

Comments:

- Lisa Connor: Mountain Line is working on implementing a transportation network, similar to Uber, which may help with the on-demand gap. More to come on this when she has further information to share. [Via provides service outside city limits, but expensive]
- Jamie and Jason: approve of the proposed updates to the plan
- Aaron: the City of Flagstaff's ADA Transition Plan is in line with the planned updates and developer coordination and will be discussed with this group and CIAL.

10. **Agency Spotlight**

The agency spotlight was presented by Marga Gamas, NAU AmeriCorps Senior Companion Program. There are three areas within the overall program: Senior Companion, Foster Grandparent, and Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP). Both the Senior companion and foster grandparent programs have income thresholds, but the RSVP program does not. This program is in 9 Arizona counties and is a 5310 grant recipient. In FY25, over 158,000 total service hours were provided.
